Neurotoxic Medication List

The medications listed in this table are potentially toxic to CMT patients. Vincristine has been proven hazardous and should be avoided by all CMT patients, including those with no symptoms. Taxols also pose a high risk to people with CMT. The remainder of the medications listed present varying degrees of potential risk for worsening CMT neuropathy.

Before taking any medication or changing medication, all CMT patients should make sure the treating physician is fully aware of their medical condition.

(Note: This table is not a complete list of brand names, manufacturers, or labeled uses. There may be others, and patients should be aware that many drugs have off-label uses. Always check the ingredients before taking any medication.)
